





legendary creations of Shri Ananda


Shankar, dance performances were



performances. Students from the upper primary, secondary and higher secondary level participated in paying their respect through songs, dance performances and




It has always been said that Music is the language of love and compassion, as words are the language of reason. The students of B.D.M.I. made this come true


